Minutes of the 7th Pattern Race and Handicapper Committee Meeting

- 1. The conclusions of the last Pattern Race Committee Meeting on January, 23rd 2009 were reviewed and confirmed.
- **2.** M. de Gasté mentions that the main purpose of this present meeting is to progress in the arranging of an international rating standard that would allow to create an international handicapping system for all pure Arabian horses running in Europe and Middle East.

For achieving such goal, the priority is to obtain from all major countries of pure Arabian racing a proper handicap listing of all their horses running.

France is one of the major countries in the world for Arabian racing. However, although there has been a big improvement in recent years, the work on Arabian handicapping in France is not yet as accurate as it should be. As the best Arabian horses in France appear at a rating of about 28, the whole table is too compressed, as there is not enough range for the lower horses. The reason for that is that France Galop feels that the performance relationship between Thoroughbreds and Arabians should be shown on the table by a difference of 30 Kilograms. The committee agrees on the fact that the real difference between the best Thoroughbred horses and the best Arabian horses is far more than 30 Kilograms, so that there is no obvious reason for doing so.

The committee therefore is unanimous in recommending to France to adopt an international scale of 0-140 that is currently running in most of the countries worldwide.

- **3.** The committee also agrees that we need to establish conversion rates between the local ratings of each country at the international scale of 0-140. In the Thoroughbred world, a rating of 59 kg in France, for instance, is converted to 130 in the international scale.
- **4.** To move on to that target, it is necessary to collect the race results of every member country. All members therefore are requested to send the full results of their group races of 2006 and 2007 to Neil Abraham (UAE) as soon as possible.
- **5.** Date of the next meeting should be in the summer 2009.
